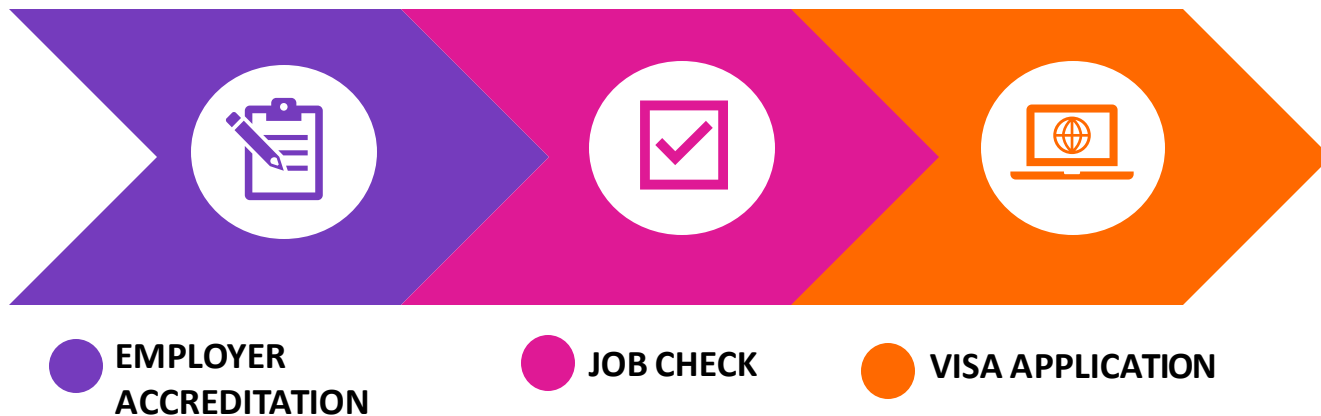

Appendix – What is the AEWV?

The Government introduced the Accredited Employer Work Visa (AEWV) to replace a number of temporary work visas. Employers need to be accredited to employ migrants on an AEWV. The process is employer-led and involves three steps – accreditation, job check and the visa application.

The AEWV is designed to ensure only good employers can hire migrant workers, and helps reduce risk of migrant exploitation.
